

# Download Death In Adam, Life In Christ

Death has three distinct manifestations: 1) spiritual death or separation from God (Eph. 2:1-2; 4:18); 2) physical death (Heb. 9:27); and 3) eternal death (also called the second death), which includes not only eternal separation from God, but eternal torment in the lake of fire (Rev. 20:11-15). Sin entered the world through one man, so also death, the consequence of sin, entered the world through that one man's sin. On the cross, Christ purchased salvation for His people. Today, R.C. Sproul considers all the benefits that flow from our justification. In *Death in Adam, Life in Christ*, the first study in the Reformed Exegetical Doctrinal Studies series, J.V. Fesko eloquently and systematically works through this doctrine, examining its long history in the church, its exegetical foundation, and its dogmatic formulation.
