Nietzsche's thought enjoyed renewed popularity in the 1960s and his ideas have since had a profound impact on 20th and early-21st century thinkers across philosophy—especially in schools of continental philosophy such as existentialism, postmodernism and post-structuralism—as well as art, literature, psychology, politics and popular culture. A well written article. You show that Nietzsche's critiques are of just as much importance today as they were when he first wrote them. I hope that eventually most, if not all, of his ideas eventually become commonplace, and not just hidden in the subcultures of postmodern art and philosophy. Kafka. Kafka's works certainly rank among the classics of modern fiction, yet one can't call them "classics" without qualification. Most of Kafka's novels are unfinished, perhaps because Kafka could find no way out of a hopeless dead-end, perhaps because Kafka thought they were unworthy of being finished.
