Gustav Meyrink (January 19, 1868 – December 4, 1932) was the pseudonym of Gustav Meyer, an Austrian author, novelist, dramatist, translator, and banker, most famous for his novel *The Golem*. He has been described as the "most respected German language writer in the field of supernatural fiction". A re'em, also re'em (Hebrew: רֵעֵם), is an animal mentioned eight times in the Hebrew Bible and variously translated as a unicorn or a wild ox. It was first identified in modern times with the aurochs by Johann Ulrich Duerst who discovered it was based on the Akkadian cognate *rimu* (? in cuneiform), meaning *Bos primigenius*, the aurochs, progenitor of cattle.
