Her Highness The Lady Mary was the eldest daughter and the second child of James, Duke of York (the future King James II of England) and his first wife Anne Hyde.. Mary was born at St. James' Palace in London on April 30, 1662. Her elder brother Charles lived for only six months and had died before Mary was born. As the daughter of King James II, she made it possible for her Dutch husband to become co-ruler of England after he had overthrown James's government. Although her father and mother were converts to Roman Mary, Queen of Scots (8 December 1542 – 8 February 1587), also known as Mary Stuart or Mary I of Scotland, reigned over Scotland from 14 December 1542 to 24 July 1567.. Mary, the only surviving legitimate child of King James V, was six days old when her father died and she acceded to the throne.
